PCA PARADE - REPORT FROM THE POCONOS

Our journey to the 66th Porsche Parade started with a mishap at the US border when we hit a pothole and destroyed one of the back tires. We have a compact spare in our 996 but knew we'd be in for a long drive at the tire's 50 mph limit. We phoned every tire shop from there to Duluth, and the answers were not encouraging.

Luckily, our friend PCA CWI Past President Gregg Elliott came to the rescue, finding a shop in Minneapolis with the make and model of tire we needed in stock. After a few delays getting around Chicago construction the next day we arrived at the Kalahari in Pocono Manor, PA at twenty minutes to midnight on Friday, dead tired.



REGISTRATION AND CONCOURS

After a restful Saturday exploring the hotel and surrounding area we got to meet up with several old friends from past Parades and our former PCA region in Manitoba. Gregg and his wife Jean arrived Sunday and Sabine volunteered for 8 hours in the welcome tent.

The concours is usually held at a nearby golf course but Monday's rain made conditions there unfavorable. PCA moved the event to the Kalahari convention center parking lot. I'd signed up as an event volunteer, which meant a 5AM start and the opportunity to help guide staging for the 200+ well-prepared Porsches. The weather was fantastic and we all enjoyed a display of cars ranging from 356s and Cayennes to 2022 911s and the ultra-rare 959.









TOURS AND ACTIVITIES

There's plenty to do at Parade - I tried sim racing for the first time in a semi-pro setting and joined Gregg for a tour of the Fabspeed factory on Tuesday. Jean and Sabine took a bus tour to a nearby winery for a wine/spirit tasting event. On Wednesday, Sabine and I took one of the scenic driving tours to America's oldest brewery, Yuengling. Back at the hotel, Sabine and Jean joined Kelly Telfer, an artist from California, for Porsches and Pinot, where they painted a Gulf 917. Other activities available during the week included RC car racing, Zone Gatherings, an Art Show, and the Parade store.

AUTOCROSS

Thursday was my first crack at Autocross. Luckily, I had a seasoned autocrosser, Gregg, to show me the ropes. PCA CWI President Jeff Buck was also on hand volunteering at the event. Rainy conditions early in the day had me a bit nervous but in the end, PCA CWI put in a good showing.

Gregg and I were in group one of two. During our four runs we switched positions in the standings several times. In the end, Gregg beat me by 3/10 of a second. Gregg finished 6th, and I came in 7th with times in the low 54-second range. Then it was our time to volunteer as track workers for the second group. We watched the best time of the Parade AutoX, with just over 40 seconds for a modified 914. Wow!



After relaxing at the Kalahari waterpark Friday, we were ready for the main event - the parade of 300+ Porsches for a lap on the famed Poconos Raceway on Saturday. Local police blocked traffic to help keep the group together. That evening, we enjoyed the victory banquet and learned the location of the 2024 parade: Birmingham, AL.


The story: I've always wanted a true sports care and obviously Porsche was at the top of the list.


Planning is just kicking off so watch the PCA CWI website and your email for details on route, food, lodging, safety tips, and other prep for the tour.






